Dear Sir,

S. With reference to your letter of the 31st ultimo, intimating that the Peruvian Government are desirous to have the steamer "LA CONSTITUCION" ex "COYA" and the sailing vessel "ELISABETH" surveyed at Callao, with a view to re-classification in the Society's Register Book, I beg to acquaint you that I have been in communication with the Pacific Steam Navigation Company, of Liverpool, on the subject, and that the Company have signified their willingness, in the special circumstances, to allow Mr. Smith, the Society's Surveyor at Valparaiso, to proceed to Callao to carry out the surveys in question.

It is understood that the Peruvian Government will be prepared to reimburse to the Pacific Steam Navigation Company the Salary of Mr. Smith during his absence from Valparaiso, and also to pay the fees for the surveys and the expenses incurred by the Surveyor in travelling to Callao and back, and during his stay at Callao.

Upon receiving your confirmation to the above effect, I shall have pleasure in communicating further with the Pacific Steam Navigation Company with a view to

their cabling the necessary instructions to Mr. Smith.
