In November last the Owners stated that they had given instructions to the Master to have the survey held at Marseilles or Constantinople.

In April last the Constantinople Surveyor stated that the vessel had been lying up for a long period at Seio where she had been scaled, cleaned &c. At the beginning of last month he stated that she had recently arrived in ballast and that he had found much done in the way of scraping, chipping and painting, but as she was leaving under charter the same day it was impossible to do more than look round. The Master, who is part Owner, assured the Surveyor

that the survey would be carried out at Constantinople and that he would arrange to stay there on the arrival of the vessel in ballast next voyage.

The Surveyor was informed that the survey must be completed on the vessel's return, and was requested to inform the Owners accordingly.

The Surveyor now states, in reply to further enquiry, that he saw the Captain on his way down to the Mediterranean recently, and that he was assured that the vessel would be stopped on the way up in ballast in order to carry out the necessary survey or at least to commence the same.
