 In reply to your letter initialed and dated as above -

The owners of the S.S. "Perkenon" are in error in imagining and stating, that the 3<sup>rd</sup> Special Survey No. 3 was carried out on the said vessel in May last at this Port.

The vessel remained here for a few days undergoing repairs to the Boilers and Machinery - From what I now learn advantage was taken of this opportunity to chip and repaint certain parts internally; but I received no intimation or request to visit her, and consequently made no survey whatever upon the Hull; and Mr. Warren's examination was solely in respect to the Machinery and Boilers.

I am told that the Master who is part owner, was under the impression that the No. 3 Survey was not due until next year - His impression was due to the No. 2 Survey having
