Reverting to your letter of the 16th and my reply of the 19th October last respecting your Bk. "EAST CROFT", I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have again had the case of this vessel under consideration today together with a communication received from the Society's Surveyor at Nantes from which it appears he has not yet been called upon to carry out the Third Special Survey No.2, and in view of the vessel being laid up at St.Nazaire, I am directed to say that the Committee are agreeable to the Survey being postponed for the present in the event of it not being convenient to you to complete the same at an early date on the conditions they usually require in cases of vessels which are overdue for Survey and are lying up indefinitely, viz:-that the Survey be completed before the vessel is again sent to sea, and that you undertake to have this done if she remain your property, and, should she be offered for sale, to inform intending purchasers that the class is allowed to remain subject to this being done, and to advise this Office of the name and address of the purchasers as soon as a sale is effected.
