I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 23rd instant, respecting the steamer "AGNES", and I note the vessel is at present under survey at Elsinore for repairs and part of the Third Periodical Survey.

In reply to your enquiry respecting the Boilers, I have to acquaint you that the Main Boiler, which was fitted in 1891, would not appear to have been constructed under Special Survey. The Main and Donkey Boilers were however examined by the Liverpool Surveyors in December, 1901, and reported to be at that time in safe working condition for the working pressures of 90 lbs. and 60 lbs. per square inch respectively. No particulars of the scantlings of the Boilers and shafting were furnished in the report of that survey, as it was not intended to class the machinery at that time. These scantlings must however now be furnished for the consideration of the Committee before the machinery of this vessel can be recommended to them for classification, and I shall therefore be glad if you will be guided accordingly.
