

Reverting to my letter of the 24th May last, respecting your barque "DECAPOLIS", I beg to remind you that the vessel's class was allowed to remain undisturbed in the Society's Register Book on the definite understanding that the Special Survey No. 3 would be completed on her arrival in the Mediterranean from Falmouth.

The Committee have had the case again before them at their meeting today, together with a communication received from the Society's Surveyors at Genoa from which it appears that no definite arrangements have yet been made in the matter, and with regard thereto I am directed to say that in view of the vessel being laid up the Committee are agreeable to the Special Survey being postponed for the present in the event of it not being convenient to you to complete the same at an early date on the condition they usually require in cases of vessels which are overdue for survey and are lying up indefinitely, viz:- that the survey be completed before the vessel is again sent to sea and that you undertake to have this done if she remain your property.
