Portion of Survey held, &c.

The 3rd S.S.No.3 became due in May 1906 and was partly held at Genoa in October 1906 by examination of the bottom in dry dock, ranging of cables, removal of mast wedges and examination of the masts, spars, rigging and decks.

In May last the Owner requested to be informed whether the Committee would allow him to send the vessel, which was then on her way to Falmouth, on a voyage to America, in the event of his obtaining a good freight, without first completing the survey. He was informed in reply that the vessel would be allowed to remain classed upon the definite understanding that the survey would be completed without fail on her arrival in the Mediterranean, where it was understood she would proceed direct from Falmouth..He stated in reply that the survey would be completed on the vessel's arrival at Genoa.

The Genoa Surveyors now state that the vessel is laid up at their port, and no definite arrangements have yet been made for completing the survey as the Owner is trying to sell her.

It is submitted the Owner be requested to furnish the usual guarantee.
