With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of your barque "DECAPOLIS", I beg to acquaint you that the Society's Surveyors at Genoa have forwarded to this Office a copy of your letter of the 17th instant respecting the Special Survey No. 3 which became due on the vessel in May last year.

The Committee have had the case under consideration at their meeting today, and in reply to your enquiry I am directed to say that the vessel's class will be allowed to remain undisturbed in the Society's Register Book upon the definite understanding that the remaining requirements of the Special Survey in question will be carried out without fail on the vessel's arrival in the Mediterranean, where it is understood she will proceed direct from Falmouth.

I have to add that the Committee much regret that in view of the matter having been standing over so long they cannot agree to the Survey being postponed for a further voyage as suggested, but it must be completed before the vessel leaves the United Kingdom or Mediterranean, or she will lose her class.
