Sir

In reply to the London letter dated
Nov. 9th in regard to the barque "Decapolis"
I beg to say that the owners stated that
they were unable to complete the survey
at this port, but that it would be com-
pleted at Buenos Aires where the vessel
is now going.

The drilling requirements were not completed
with owing to the short time for which
the floating dock could be obtained.

The bowsprit wedges have not been re-
moved & I regret not having mentioned
this on my report. I shall feel obliged if
you will kindly have this noted.

With regard to the rigging I have to
say that no documentary evidence was

produced to show that it had been recently lifted, but as service & splicing was stripped off nips, bends & splices, wherever required, & the wire & bolsters found in good order, the masters statement was accepted & the lifting of the rigging was not insisted on in this particular case.

Owing to the distance from home I did not submit the case to the Committee as is usual, thinking I might be allowed to arrange the matter on the spot.
