H.M. TRAWLER "CAMPINA" SUNK

The Secretary of the Admiralty regrets to announce that H.M. trawler *Campina* (Temporary Skipper F. Wellburn, R.N.R.) has been sunk by an enemy mine. Three survivors have been landed safely, but it is feared that the commanding officer and 10 ratings have lost their lives. The next of kin have been informed.

The *Campina*, of 289 tons gross, was formerly owned by the Vinor Steam Fishing Company, Ltd. (J. Little, Ltd., managers), of Grimsby. She was built by Cochrane & Sons, Ltd., Selby, in 1913.
