Surveyed the Steel Screw Steamer "FIRBOLCH" 1261 tons gross of London, whilst the vessel was lying afloat at Tilbury and subsequently in Blackwall Dry Dock on account of damage stated caused by enemy action on the 8th November, 1940, and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed with fresh record of survey 4-41, subject to indented shell plates F.7, G.5, 6, 8, H.5 & 7 and J.5 from aft on starboard side being repaired as necessary at a favourable opportunity,

being fit to carry heavy and perishable cargoes (cargo battens not fitted)
