Précis of particulars of Casualty While this vessel was stranded in the Thames Estuary she was hit by two bombs on the 2nd August, 1940. She caught fire, was completely gutted, her back was broken and she gradually settled down, the after main deck being awash at high water. The decks were buckled and collapsed, the superstructures collapsed and burnt away, and it is stated that salvage is hopeless.
