Dear Sir,

In accordance with the request contained in your letter of the 4th inst I have today sent on to Mr. Green, the Superintendent of Lloyd's Proving House, Ketchington, two of the defective links I cut from the chain cables of the T.S.M.V. Coneh, the other two links were sent to you by Mr. Lewis of the Glasgow Office.

With regard to the link which broke and caused the loss of the cable and anchor, one half of this was sent by Messrs Harland & Wolff to Messrs Colville for tests to be made of the material, and from the other half, a tensile test piece was prepared by them and sent to me for testing, it is therefore

therefore impossible for W. Green to have this
link. Messrs Harland & Wolff have the extreme
ends of the half-link on which distinct signs
of damage can be seen.
