 Track and sundry iron work damaged.

Note:- In order to enable the vessel to complete her racing engagements the mast of "WESTRA" (No. 7723 in the Yacht Register) to be slightly lengthened by suitable glued scarf at heel and adapted to suit mountings, and shipped temporarily.
