S.S. "CLAN MACNAB", "CLAN MACNAIR" "CLAN MACNEIL"

The Builders of the above vessels, Messrs. The Ayrshire Dockyard Co., have made an enquiry in regard to freeboard. These steamers are closed shelter deck vessels and the freeboards originally assigned to them were dealt with on that basis. It now appears that the Owners propose to make an alteration in them by cutting a tonnage opening in the shelter deck and fitting a 'tween deck bulkhead, all as shown on the plan herewith, which has been provided by the Builders.

The Owners desire to know what the freeboard would be under the new conditions and I have prepared a report, which is submitted herewith for the consideration of the Committee. One report only is sent as the particulars for the vessels are in each case the same.

The Builders have asked me to request that the provisional freeboard may be sent as soon as convenient.

The approved plans for these vessels are in the London office.
