## "Francolin" Sinks After Being Hit

An Admiralty communique states:—  
"A Dornier 17 which attacked H.M. trawler *Francolin* (Skipper Lieutenant J. L. Dinwoodie, R.N.R.), and Commander *Holbrook* (Chief Skipper A. S. V. Jones, R.N.R.) on Wednesday was shot down into the sea by the combined fire of the two trawlers. In the engagement H.M. trawler *Francolin* was hit by a bomb and the Board of Admiralty regrets to announce that she subsequently sank. One man lost his life. The next-of-kin has been informed. There were no survivors from the crew of the Dornier."
