Précis of particulars of Casualty Sunk by a German raider about 600

miles from the Azores during the week ended

8th September, 1940.

CYMBELINE.—Barranquilla, Sept. 26.—
British tank steamer Cymbeline was
sunk by a German raider about three
weeks ago after a brief exchange of
shots 600 miles from the Azores, accord-
ing to her master, Captain James Chad-
wick, who has arrived at Barranquilla.
Captain Chadwick, with his first
engineer and third officer, spent 14 days
in an open boat before being picked up
and brought to Barranquilla on a tanker.
The fate of the other 32 members of
the crew has not yet been ascertained.
The Cymbeline was on her way from
Gibraltar to Trinidad when sunk.—
British United Press.
