RAIDER AT LARGE IN ATLANTIC

Two British Ships Sunk

The Admiralty issued the following  
communique last evening:—

With reference to a Press report  
that two British merchant ships, *King*  
*John* and *Davisian*, have been sunk  
by the enemy in the region of the  
West Indies, it is confirmed that these  
ships have been sunk by an enemy  
raider known to be at large in the  
Atlantic. All British merchant ships  
have been warned. The raider is  
believed to be a converted merchant  
vessel.
