We beg to submit herewith for the consideration of the Committee a proposal to fit gooseneck ventilators to the accommodation of Messrs. Cochrane & Sons Yard No.1184.

It is proposed to fit these ventilators approximately 14" high to the underside of the bend.

A provisional freeboard has been assigned to the vessel, and the Builders wish to retain this freeboard. In view of this, please inform us if these ventilators can be approved at the height as proposed; if not, please state the minimum height required.

A general arrangement plan is forwarded herewith for dealing with the case, and we shall be glad if you will kindly return it to us in due course.


