the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Mr. D.S. Bauld, Marshall of the Admiralty Court in Prize, examine the Steel Sc. "ERIK BOYE" 2238 gross tons register of Copenhagen, with a view to ascertaining her present value.

This vessel was built at Nakskov in 1924, and is fitted with triple expansion engines of 1380 Indicated Horse Power.

The undersigned examined the vessel whilst lying afloat in Bedford Basin, N. S., on May 9th and 10th, 1940.

The general condition of the hull, machinery, fittings and equipment, so far as could be seen without opening up, is good, and the accommodation ample for the crew carried.

After making due allowances for condition and age, I have fixed the present value based on a replacement basis in Canada at the present time at three hundred and thirty one thousand one hundred and ninety one dollars (\$331,191.00)
