ARABUTAN. Washington, D.C., Mar. 9.
 The Navy Department tonight con-
 firms that the Brazilian steamer
 Arabutan has been torpedoed off the
 Atlantic coast. Reuter. (See issue of

Rio Janeiro, Mar. 9.—
 It was later noted that the Brazilian
 steamer Arabutan was sunk 70 miles
 from Newport News between 10 p.m.
 and midnight on Saturday (Mar. 7). She
 was on her way from the United States
 with a cargo of 2680 tons of coal.
 Reuter.

Rio Janeiro, Mar. 9.—
 The Brazilian Foreign Ministry, in an
 official note confirming the torpedoing of
 the Brazilian steamer Arabutan without
 warning on Saturday (Mar. 7), states
 that one man was killed and two
 seriously injured. The remainder of
 the crew have been saved. Reuter.
