
With reference to your letter of the 12th ultimo regarding the steamer "GIANNOULIS GOUNARIS", I think it well to enclose herewith for your information, copy of a letter which has today been addressed to the Director of Ship Management at the Ministry of Shipping, from which you will observe that upon their special application, the Committee have agreed to a further extension of the vessel's class for six months, subject to such general examination as is appropriate to her state and age. I shall be glad to learn in due course, at what port the requisite inspection can be made, in order that the necessary instructions may be given to the local Surveyors.

As regards load line it is observed that the Greek Government load line certificate was issued to this ship in April 1936 and it is concluded that this will be valid until April 1941. A periodical survey was carried out by the Society's Surveyors at Hull in January of last year at the request of the local Greek Consul, and it would appear therefore, that the proposed extension of six months in the class, would be covered by the present load line certificates. I shall be glad, however, to receive your confirmation on this point.
