This is to certify that I, the undersigned Surveyor did, at the request of Messrs. Burns Philp & Co. Ltd, Lloyd's Agents at the port of Townsville and Messrs. Adelaide Steamship Co. Ltd, Agents for the M.V. "HYLTON", Commanded by W. O'Connell, Official Number 161601, Gross Tonnage 8197, Nett Tonnage 3040, built at Sunderland, Registered Newcastle, British, attend on board that vessel whilst berthed at No. 1. Berth, Townsville, Jetty Wharf, on July 31st, to survey Main Holds and Shelter Decks, 1, 2, 4, 5 and again on August 2nd to survey No. 3. Deep Tanks Port and Starboard. All Bilges examined, Pumps in good order.

On examination I found these spaces in good order, clean, well dunnaged with Timber and exposed Iron on Tunnel etc. covered with Burlap. Sugar stowed clear of Iron Bulkheads.

The stowage and distribution has my approval and in my opinion the vessel is fit to carry the cargo of Raw Sugar on the contemplated voyage to the United Kingdom.
