*to Leixoes Harbour in foggy weather on the 23rd*  
*October. Position exposed and vessel gradually*  
*broke up by the seas and has now disappeared.*

HANNAH.—Lisbon, Oct. 24.—Swedish steamer Hannah, with a cargo of coal and carrying International Red Cross mail from England, ran aground yesterday at Leixoes. The entire crew are safe, but the cargo and the vessel are believed to be a total loss.—Reuter.

HANNAH.—Oporto, Oct. 23.—Swedish steamer Hannah, Cardiff for Leixoes, cargo coal and mails, when entering port this morning stranded on submerged breakwater about 150 yards outside Leixoes Harbour and remains. All crew landed in local lifeboat. Vessel now lies with bow suspended on breakwater and hull submerged from amidships aft; believed holed and inundated from No. 2 to afterpeak. Position very exposed and salvage at present impracticable.

HANNAH.—Oporto, Oct. 29. — Steamer Hannah: Position continues as reported in our cable of Oct. 26. Funnel now carried away and close inspection still hindered by bad weather. Little prospect of refloat, but endeavouring to obtain offers "no cure no pay" for salvage of vessel and cargo.—Lloyd's Agent per Salvage Association. (See issue of Oct. 28.)

HANNAH.—Oporto, Nov. 5. — Swedish steamer Hannah: Floating impossible.—Lloyd's Agent per Salvage Association. (See issue of Nov. 1.)

HANNAH.—Oporto, Nov. 18. — Swedish steamer Hannah was broken up by seas yesterday and has entirely disappeared.—Lloyd's Agent per Salvage Association. (See issue of Nov. 7.)
