F. I am in receipt of your letter of the 5th instant enclosing one you have received from Messrs. W. Tulley & Co., Ltd relative to the issue of the Convention freeboard certificate in respect of the s.s. "HANNAH", and with regard thereto have to inform you that the new freeboards were marked on the ship's sides and verified at Malmo in December last, and on the 10th December the Society's Surveyor at that port wrote that he had received the Convention freeboard certificate and certified copy in respect of this vessel from the Society's Gothenburg Office and enquired whether the fee for the remeasurement survey carried out at Ipswich in November 1932 had been paid, in order that the certificates could be forwarded to the Owners.

In reply he was informed on the 12th December that an account for the fee had been rendered to Messrs. W. Tulley & Co., Ltd but according to records in this Office it had not been paid up to the time of writing.
