It is submitted before this case receives the consideration the Committee, it should be pointed out to the Surveyors that in the ordinary course the assignment of a notation 'Examined (with date)' implies, in accordance with Circular No. 1772, that the vessel has been found or placed in efficient condition for a period of 12 months, but in view of the outstanding repairs to be dealt with on the vessel's return the Surveyors are not in order in recommending a notation of 'Examined (with date)'.

It is not clear why these very necessary repairs in the peak and deep tanks were not carried out at this time.

It is essential that in every case the period for which the vessel is considered efficient should be clearly indicated in the Surveyors' recommendation, and in the present instance the limit of time within which it is considered repairs in the peak and deep tanks require to be carried out should be stated.

The Surveyors should be requested to furnish their remarks and indicate within what limit of time the vessel is expected to return to the United Kingdom.
