I beg to inform you that the T.S.S. "LETICIA" has been under the inspection of the Society's Surveyors at Curacao with a view to the assignment of Convention freeboards, and it is found from their report that the freeboards as shown on the accompanying memorandum could be assigned when the Dutch West Indies Government have adopted the Load Line Convention, subject to the following conditions being complied with:-


Efficient means of closing being provided for all ventilators and air pipes.
