With reference to the steamer "LETICIA".

I beg to enclose herewith the Dutch freeboard assignment letter and a copy of Report No. 12. The letter being received from the Trieste Surveyors who state that the Dutch lettering has not been put on the vessel, as this was too late, and as the Owners insisted upon the Dutch certificates being issued, I have handed same in to the Owners at this Port, which has also been reported to the Dutch Freeboard Commission. I have however requested the Owners to have the Dutch lettering put on the vessel upon her arrival at Willemstad, which they have promised to do.

In connection with this case, it may be well to inform the surveyors outside Holland, in dealing with Dutch vessels, to have the lettering put on in Dutch, as soon as they receive your assignment letter, as it often occurs that only at the last moment we are able to furnish the certificates and the Dutch assignment letter for signature.

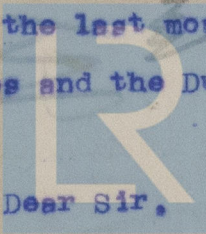
