In reply to your letter of the 26th instant in reference to the freeboard report on the Ex-German Steamer "Spes" I have to inform you that a sketch of the steel plate ^{ltd} ~~board~~ doors at bridge front is enclosed.

I have to thank you for the definition of the term "doors" as applicable to freeboard which will receive our careful attention in future cases.

In reference to the freeing ports in the well I have to state that the number is four for both sides, the height of the bridge is 7 feet from the upper deck and 3 feet from the raised Quarter Deck.

Trusting the above information will be as desired and I regret omitting same on my report.
