The 409-ton Hull motor ship Hullgate, sank near Flushing yesterday after a collision with the London freighter Moyle (1,761 tons). The crew of seven were taken to Flushing. —B.U.P. and Reuter.

According to Reuter the Dutch salvage vessel Meermin has located the wreck of the British motorship Hullgate (409 tons gross), which sank off Flushing on Sunday after having been in collision with the British steamer Moyle.
