how done: Vessel placed in dry dock, bottom crudder cleaned and examined

Rudder, intermediate stock, upper stock, equidistant removed and sent to forge for repairs. New main piece and intermediate stock fitted. Keyways in rudder head built up by E.W. and recut. All re-shipped into position and rudder tried over on completion of repairs & found satisfactory. Forging report attached. Steering chain annealed and examined. Steering gear sheaves & pins opened up and exam'd. - 4 sheave pins renewed. Vertical counter plate faired in
