"JEVINGTON COURT"
The British steamer *Jevington Court* struck a mine in the North Sea. The crew of 35 were saved and landed at an East Coast port yesterday. Owned by Court Line, Ltd. (Haldin & Philipps, Ltd.), of London, the *Jevington Court* is a vessel of 4544 tons gross, built by Workman, Clark & Co., Ltd., Belfast, in 1925.

Date of Casualty *24th February, 1940.*

Précis of particulars of Casualty This vessel is reported to have been sunk by a mine in the North Sea on the 24th February, 1940.

The Owners concur.

The steamer *Jevington Court*, of London, was sunk by a mine in the North Sea on Saturday. The crew have been landed at an East Coast port. The *Jevington Court* (4,544 tons) is owned by Court Line, Limited, and was built at Belfast in 1925. She was attacked by German aircraft on January 12, but no damage was done. Though several of the crew of 35 were slightly injured they were able to take to the boats, and were picked up soon afterwards.


