The class is subject to the tank top plating in the after hold being permanently repaired on the vessel's arrival at the Tyne, and the vessel being further examined in drydock at the first available opportunity. The Newcastle Surveyors now report the vessel placed in drydock, the bottom coated, and on account of damage caused by enemy aircraft, the falling of a hatch beam and contact with another vessel, 2 shell plates, 1 tank top plate <sup>repaired</sup> renewed, and minor repairs carried out. It is submitted the vessel appears worthy to remain as classed with record of survey 2.40, without special condition.
