Précis of particulars of Casualty This vessel is reported to have been sunk by a mine in the North Sea on the 29th February 1940.

"MARIA ROSA"

The Italian steamer Maria Rosa, 4211 tons gross, sank in the North Sea on Thursday night following an explosion, when about 14 miles from shore. She was bound for an East Coast port. Sixteen men, including a pilot, reached the Suffolk coast yesterday in two boats; also a dead man was landed. It is understood that 11 members of the crew are missing and it is feared they were trapped below. The Maria Rosa, which was owned by F. Galli fu G., of Genoa, was built in 1911.
