GREEK SHIP SUNK BY
SUBMARINE

27 SURVIVORS LANDED

Our Stornoway Correspondent telegraphs that the Danish steamer Sicilien arrived in Stornoway yesterday to land the survivors of a Greek ship which was sunk by a submarine in the Atlantic. Twenty-seven survivors were landed; 20 were uninjured, and seven injured. Several of the injured survivors who were stretcher cases were taken to the Lewis Hospital. It is understood that two members of the crew were killed.
