The master of the Lowland, Captain Watler of Shields, was rescued, but has since died from injuries.

SINKING OF THE "LOWLAND"

The British steamer Lowland, 974 tons gross, has been sunk in the North Sea. She carried a crew of 15, of whom five are known to have been saved; the master was also rescued, but has since died from injuries; the remaining nine men are missing. The Lowland, which was owned by the Shipping & Coal Company, Ltd., London, was built at Rotterdam in 1911 as Noord-Holland.
