With reference to my letter of the 13th and yours of the 20th instant respecting Messrs. Bartram & Sons' Nos. 282 and 283 ships, I return herewith two copies of the plan of midship section, and with regard thereto I have to state that provided the scantlings and arrangements as shewn and amended be adhered to, the Rules in all other respects be complied with, and the materials and workmanship be to the Society's satisfaction, the vessels will be eligible to be classed 100A1 with a freeboard corresponding to a draught not exceeding that contemplated by the Rules for a complete superstructure vessel having a tonnage opening.

As requested by the Builders' representative over the telephone one copy of the profile and deck plan, forwarded with your letter of the 20th, has been dealt with only in respect of the thicknesses of the upper and second deck plating, and I shall be glad if you will arrange for a further copy of this plan to be submitted for final consideration of the remaining items.
