Employment of Chromador Steel

The point put in this letter was considered by the Committee in April, 1935 on a request made by Messrs. R. & W. Hawthorn, Leslie & Co. It was then decided that as it was not proposed that any reductions in scantlings should be made following upon the adoption of a special steel, no further tests beyond the normal routine tests should be required.

It is submitted the Middlesbrough Surveyors be informed to this effect. The material will, of course, not be specially branded, and normal fees should be charged.

The Sunderland Surveyors should be advised.

The Middlesbrough Surveyors might also be advised that the Sunderland Surveyors have been informed/in the above sense, and it is understood from them that full particulars of the amount of this special steel and the places where it is proposed to be used have been communicated to them.
