We note also what is said re the fitting of fins to rudder post, the necessary care will be taken re the attachment of same, all being done to the entire satisfaction of your local Surveyor.

In regard to investigations re the risks of torsional vibration under the new conditions, the Owners have decided to leave this in abeyance for the present, and to see what are the results obtained in the first vessel.
