

whilst she was lying afloat,

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's
Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs
recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and
that I have Recommended that she be continued as classed
in the Society's Register Book, without fresh record of survey,
The notation of decks in the Register Book to be altered to
"1 Dk. (steel) 2nd Dk. (steel) in Nos. 1, 2, 3 & 4 holds",
being fit to carry dry and perishable Cargoes.
