"JOSEPHINE CHARLOTTE"
The Belgian steamer Josephine Charlotte struck a mine and sank off the south-east coast on Tuesday morning. Thirty-seven survivors were picked up by a British steamer and landed at a British port on Tuesday night. Five of the 37 were injured and taken to hospital. Four of the crew are missing. The Josephine Charlotte was a vessel of 3310 tons gross, owned by the Compagnie Maritime Belge (Lloyd Royal) S.A. (managers, Agence Maritime Internationale). She was built at Rotterdam in 1929.
