SWEDISH SHIP SUNK  
BY U-BOAT11 SURVIVORS BUT 20  
MISSING

The Swedish steamer Svartön (2,475 tons), of Stockholm, was torpedoed by a German submarine off the North Coast of Scotland yesterday. The ship sank in a minute and a half.

Twenty of the crew are missing. Eleven survivors who took to a raft were picked up by a lifeboat. One survivor was picked up by shipmates after being 40 minutes in the water. A trawler found the men on the raft, and later transferred them to a lifeboat.

The rescued seamen were taken to a first-aid post for attention to minor injuries, and were provided with food and clothing.

The second steamer attacked was the Svartön, 2,475 tons, of Stockholm, which was torpedoed by a German submarine 10 miles off the North-East Coast of Scotland.

The ship sank in a minute and a half, and 20 of the crew are missing.

The Svartön was struck by a torpedo in the boiler-room. The combined explosion of the boiler and the torpedo had a double effect. Everyone amidships and on the bridge had been killed or so severely injured that they had not the slightest chance when hurled into the water.

Among those who perished was a Norwegian pilot who had been unable to leave the ship when his pilotage duties were over.

Eleven survivors picked up by a lifeboat are now in a Scottish hospital.
