Dear Sirs,

S. With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the motorship "CABO PALOS", I beg to acquaint you that in a letter, dated 12th instant, received from the Society's Surveyors at Marseilles, they stated that the vessel had left the previous day for Alicante, but that your Representative did not know her future movements.

The Surveyors add that nothing was done in connexion with the machinery survey of this vessel at Marseilles, and with regard to this case I think it well to let you know that to complete the Special Survey No.2 in respect of the machinery a few crankshaft journals, the air receivers, pumping arrangements and some of the pumps require to be examined. The Special Survey of the hull, however, has been completed.


I shall therefore be obliged if you will keep this case before you with a view to an opportunity being taken for the outstanding matters to be dealt with as soon as you are in a position to arrange for this to be done.

As you are aware the Special Survey became due so long ago as January, 1935.
