PARIS, Nov. 20.—The sinking on Saturday of the Yugoslav steamer Carica Milica after hitting a mine off the South-East Coast of England, was announced to-day by the owners, Jugoslavenski Lloyd Navigation Company, according to a message from Belgrade. The crew were saved, it is added. The Carica Milica was one of the company's most modern vessels and was carrying a cargo of coal from London to Dubrovnik.—Reuter.
