the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of Messrs Newport News S. & D. D. Co. make examination of the S. S. "MUMINDIES" of New York, 3759 tons net register while lying under construction, at the works of Messrs Newport News S. & D. D. Co on December 4th, 1917, in order to ascertain the nature and extent of damage stated sustained through the breaking of a derrick pole on December 3rd, 1917, causing the crow's nest to fall from foremast causing damage to one ventilator and one cargo boom.

On examination FOUND:-

The back plate and brackets of crow's nest bent.

The cowl of port ventilator to No 1 Hold smashed.

One cargo boom scored and cut locally.

RECOMMENDED:-

The back plate to crow's nest to be faired and reinforced with one angle bar.

The two plate brackets to be cut off, faired and replaced.

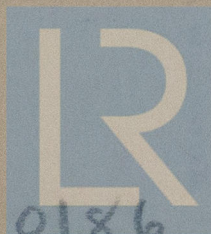
A new cowl to be fitted to the port ventilator of No 1 Hold.

One cargo boom to be trimmed up and repainted where damaged.
