With reference to our Freeboard report No. 17959 on the steamer "JAMESON" which is being forwarded to-day, the following are the particulars of the moulded displacement and tons per inch at the draughts given, as supplied by the builders, Messrs Wm. Dobson & Co., WALKER-ON-TYNE, to the Society's Newcastle office, viz.,

Moulded displacement at a moulded draught equal to 85% of the moulded depth = 8,733 tons.

The external displacement at extreme draughts of :-

22 ft.	= 8,670 tons	- 35.31 tons per inch.
23 ft.	= 9,095 "	- 35.38 " " "
