"DAGHESTAN"
The British tanker Daghestan was sunk in the North Sea on Sunday night. Sixteen members of the crew were landed at a port in the north-east of Scotland on Tuesday night. The men stated that when their vessel went down the crew took to the boats, one of which overturned. The master and three men were drowned. The Daghestan, which was a steam tanker of 5742 tons gross, built by Short Bros. Ltd., Sunderland, in 1921, was owned by Common Bros., Ltd., of Newcastle.


