—London, Mar. 10.—With reference to the report emanating from Reuter in issue of Mar. 10, the owners of the steamer Sultan Star state: The tug Seefalke proceeded from St. Vincent (C.V.) to take the Sultan Star in tow to Liverpool by arrangement between ourselves and the tug owners. The Sultan Star was not in distress, and our steamer Stuart Star had been escorting her back to St. Vincent (C.V.) until the tug was able to get out to take her in tow.
