## "SINT ANNALAND"

The Dutch steamer *Sint Annaland* struck a mine off the Dutch coast yesterday and sank. The crew were rescued by another Dutch vessel. The *Sint Annaland* was a vessel of 2248 tons gross, built at Schiedam in 1916. She was owned by the Scheepvaart en Steenkolen Maats. N.V., Rotterdam.
