This is to Certify that I have

Surveyed the S.S. "SLIET ANNALEND", of Rotterdam, 2243 tons gross, whilst lying afloat at Ostend after alleged loss of two bower anchors and four lengths of anchor chain cable on the 15th and 16th January 1940,

and that I have transmitted to the Committee of Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, a Report, stating that all repairs recommended by me have been completed to my satisfaction, and

*that I have **Recommended** that she be continued as classed in the Society's Register Book, without fresh record of survey, subject to one length of chain cable and a bower anchor now placed on board being verified with the test certificates and to another bower anchor and three lengths of anchor chain cable being placed on board at the first convenient opportunity, to complete being fit to carry dry and perishable cargoes.*
